

	APPLICANT IN A DISCIPLINARY PROCESS IN ANOTHER JURISDICTION POLICY

Background

All applicants to the Prince Edward Island College of Nursing and Midwifery (PEICNM) must meet the requirements set out in the Regulated Health Professions Act and the Regulations before the Registrar can place the applicant on the Register. Individuals wanting to use the designation of Registered Nurse, Registered Psychiatric Nurse, Nurse Practitioner, Licensed Practical Nurse, or Registered Midwife in the province of Prince Edward Island must be registered with the College.

Purpose

To ensure public protection, all applicants must provide proof to the College that their license/registration was in good standing in any jurisdiction where they were previously registered. This policy describes the process to follow when a complaint has been submitted for an applicant regarding their practice in another jurisdiction and/or a disciplinary process is underway in another jurisdiction.

1.0 Policy

- 1.1 Applicants are required to provide a verification of registration from all current regulatory bodies where they hold a registration.
- 1.2 The Director of Registration Services shall review the applicant's application to ensure that all requirements are met.
- 1.3 If an applicant submits a verification that indicates that there has been a complaint made against their practice or they are undergoing a disciplinary process in another jurisdiction, the Services shall refer the application to the Registrar.
- 1.4 The Registrar shall then refer the application to Council.

- 1.5 Council shall review the application, as per RHPA Section 25(1) and 25(2), and either (a) direct the Registrar to register the applicant with any conditions on the registration that the council sees fit, or (b) may refuse the application for registration until the disciplinary matter is completed in the other jurisdiction.
- 1.6 The Registrar will then notify the applicant of the Council's decision.
