Created in direct response to the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Calls to Action, the directive reflects PEICNM's commitment to embedding Mi'kmaq culture and values into nursing and midwifery practice on the Island. The document displays stunning art work from El'taqati'kw Digital Studios.

This practice directive will be incorporated into the continuing competency program in the upcoming renewal year. More information will be provided in the near future.

A proper introduction includes your name as it appears on the public register, your designation, and your role in the client's care. For example, "Hello, my name is Jane Doe and I'm a Registered Nurse. Today, I'll be reviewing your care plan".
